

HELPFUL INFO FOR FRESHMEN PARENTS CLASS OF 2026

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Please check RangerNet for any date changes or event updates. The school calendar will be released in July 2022. Please check the dates once the final school calendar is available; the dates listed here are tentative until confirmed on the official calendar.

ACADEMICS

- Course schedules will be posted on RangerNet in July. Any questions may be directed to Dr. Ben Kirby, Assistant Principal for Curriculum and Academic Support, by phone at ext 560 or by email at <u>bkirby@jesuitcp.org</u>. Freshman schedule change day is in early August (TBA), generally the second week of school from 9:00am – noon.
- Books -booklists for each student will be available through Jesuit's website
 <u>https://www.jesuitdallas.org/students/textbooks</u> when schedules are released. Be sure to
 make note of which texts will be provided by Jesuit electronically free of charge.
- School photos (for yearbook and student IDs) are taken during Freshmen Orientation on Wednesday, August 17th. All students should have a white shirt and tie for the photo and a school approved haircut. Most boys wear a white shirt and tie with athletic shorts and tennis shoes—it's quite the look! Nametags and PE locks are also distributed on this day. The Ranger Connection store will be open for any spirit wear purchases.
- Purchase specific school supplies <u>after</u> the first day of class as specified by each teacher.
- Label all books, notebooks, clothing, etc. because freshmen tend to misplace their things.
- **Personal Responsibility Time (PRT)** is scheduled into each day and is a time for students to study, meet with teachers, get assistance in the math lab, work in the Information Commons, go to the Counseling Commons, etc. Freshmen may not enter the senior courtyard and cannot leave campus.
- **Rangernet** is an invaluable resource loaded with detailed, up-to-date information. By now, you should have received your own login and password for Rangernet. Grades, schedules, teacher communications, the school calendar, parent and student directories, and many other parent resources can be accessed through RangerNet. - It is highly recommended that you access RangerNet often enough to stay informed, but not so often that your son doesn't learn to take responsibility for himself. General recommendation is once per week, but this will vary significantly from family to family.

DRESS CODE

- Freshmen <u>must wear khaki pants</u>, <u>dress shirt</u> (white, yellow, blue or pink), a <u>tie</u>, a <u>belt</u>, <u>socks</u> and <u>dress shoes</u>.
- <u>Ties</u> expressive of their personal style. No bow ties or string ties allowed. <u>No caps</u> may be worn during school hours or inside the building.
- <u>Navy blazers</u> are worn during the winter months (usually Nov Feb/Mar). Students must wear blazers all day except during lunch or when given permission by a teacher in



the classroom. Consider visiting St. Ignatius Closet (see below) or purchasing blazers second-hand at Salvation Army or Goodwill stores. They will be stuffed in gym bags and thrown on the ground for impromptu football games after school so don't feel the need to buy an expensive one.

- <u>Nametags</u> will be issued at Freshmen Orientation. The first one is free, but extra or replacement tags may be purchased before September 16th from a counselor for \$10.00.
- <u>Shoes</u> Dress shoes or Sperry type shoes, no sneakers—black, brown, or cordovan in color and in good repair in keeping with Jesuit's dress code.
- <u>St. Ignatius Closet</u>: great source for gently used uniform items, hosted by the Jesuit Women's Auxiliary (JWA), open every 3rd Thursday of the month from 2:00-6:00pm in the Terry Center Foyer; for more info, please visit https://www.jesuitdallas.org/parents/jwa/events/saint-ignatius-closet

TRANSITION INTO HIGH SCHOOL

• The best way for freshmen to meet other freshmen (and girls) is to participate in extracurricular activities & attend various campus events. All information about school organizations can be found on the website under the "Clubs" link. In addition, a Club Fair is held at orientation.

SERVICE AND JUSTICE

- As part of understanding the "Men for Others" motto, all Jesuit students are required to complete community service each year.
- Freshmen are required to attend specific workshops at school and participate in specified community service projects in order to complete their service requirements. This is all carefully planned and organized by Jesuit. Outside community service work, although awesome for your college applications, will not be applied to your Jesuit community service requirement.
- Freshmen are not required to track their service hours as attendance will be taken at all events.
- Parents will be advised of their student's progress on a quarterly basis via email.

FRESHMAN RETREAT

- Freshman retreat will be held on Wednesday, September 28, 2022 from 8:00am-3:00pm at the school.
- All freshmen are required to attend! Please mark your calendars and be sure your son is there!
- The retreat begins with a family Mass in the Terry Center at 8:00am—all parents/families are invited to attend. Dismissal is at 3:00 pm.

MUSIC

ATHLETICS



- All freshmen, unless they are in band, will satisfy their P.E. credit through participation in their assigned Freshman Experience course. Tryouts for the various sports teams are arranged within this P.E. period. Families will be sent an Athletic Information document from the athletic department with answers to many frequently asked questions and dates for various team try-outs.
- The P.E. dress code will be shared with students during orientation.
- Students are assigned a P.E. locker which <u>must have a regulation P.E. lock issued for</u> <u>free by Student Affairs.</u> <u>Locks are a must!</u> There are countless visiting teams from other schools in our locker rooms.
- Have your son ask the P.E. teacher about Intramural Sports (which are separate from the traditional sports teams). Students can also listen for announcements about intramurals during the school day.

SOCIAL

- The Freshman Mixer (with Ursuline) is the first social event for the freshmen. Details are being finalized and information will be sent out via the weekly Ranger Report email.
- Freshmen should learn the Jesuit yell and fight song they may be called upon at lunchtime to recite or sing it by the upper classmen. Typically, the freshmen will learn this at Freshmen Orientation and from their assigned Big Brothers.

WORK GRANT

• Mr. Rob McGhee, ext. 311, is in charge of the work grant program (hint: try to get hours completed in the summer if possible & keep a separate log at home of hours worked).

PARENT MEETING & PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES

- The first parent meeting ("meet the teacher") is scheduled for Wednesday, September 21, 2022. Details will be sent out closer to the date in the weekly Ranger Report email. Please check the RangerNet calendar for any schedule changes to the date.
- Though not a required event, parent-teacher conferences will be held in October and provide a great opportunity to dialog with faculty. Detailed instructions will be sent out on how and when to sign up for these conferences via the Ranger Report. Sign-ups will occur via an online system during a specified time period.
- You do not have to meet with every teacher, but will definitely want to schedule an appointment with a teacher *if you have concerns*.
- Be sure to **sign up early** for the best chance of meeting with the teachers you want to see.
- The school calendar will have the sign-up dates posted well in advance.

PARENT EXCHANGE & PSAT/COLLEGE PLACEMENT MEETING

• All freshmen and their parents are encouraged to attend this very important meeting scheduled for January 25, 2023. Please double check RangerNet for any schedule changes to the date.



- Meeting includes an interactive small group discussion between parents and freshmen moderated by junior and senior retreat leaders. Former freshmen parents say "this activity is a must".
- PSAT scores and college placement information will be presented on this night.
- This is a valuable and insightful evening. Please mark it on your calendar and plan to attend!

HOMECOMING

- Homecoming- 3 parts- Ranger Day and Pre-Game BBQ, Homecoming Football Game, and Dance
 - 1. Ranger Day Friday, October 28 (8:00 a.m. noon)

A tradition at Jesuit that the boys really look forward to...a day of games and contests. Wear casual clothing (T-shirts and shorts) or a costume to school. Students sign up in advance for various events and competitions. See counselors for sign-ups.

Chariot races: Freshman and their big brothers are provided with a chariot which they decorate. The chariots are raced on the football field track at the end of Ranger Day. This is a very entertaining event that parents can watch. The race is live-streamed or you can attend in person.

2. The Game – Friday, October 28, 7:30 p.m. at Jesuit

Students can purchase tickets in advance. Dress is casual. Boys usually buy the game tickets if they have dates. *Mums*- boys get these for the girls to wear to the game; *Garters*—girls get these for the boys to wear to the game. Order early and support the Booster Club or make your own. It's a good idea to call the girl's mother to help arrange for driving, pregame pictures, dinner, etc. The freshmen often go in groups to take pictures and have dinner before the game. Not everyone will have a date and groups of boys often attend the game together. Information on purchasing mums and game tickets will be sent out closer to the date in the weekly Ranger Report.

3. Dance – Saturday, Saturday, October 22, 7:00 -11:00pm

It is dressy, but not formal, especially for the younger students. <u>Many of the boys go</u> <u>stag in a group of friends and that is fine!</u> Corsages or hand held bouquets of flowers can be ordered from any florist or grocery store floral department. Order at least 2-3 days in advance. If possible, find out the color of the girl's dress to coordinate flowers and boy's tie.

- **Dinner:** Parents can help the kids choose a restaurant that takes reservations. Sometimes parents will host a dinner for several couples in their homes.
- Allow plenty of time for hair disasters and photo taking (for the girls...). Optional pictures may be taken at the dance.
- Call the girl's mom to confirm the arrangements.
- Students often go in groups of 2 or more couples.
- Once a student leaves the dance, he/she will not be re-admitted. If a student arrives late to the dance (typically after 8:00pm), a parent must be present to sign the student into the dance.
- Limos or party buses are HIGHLY discouraged. The dance is a toned-down homecoming; it's not prom.



• Boys purchase tickets in advance to the dance and must remember to bring them. Information on ticket purchase will be sent out in the weekly Ranger Report closer to the date.

MOTHER SON BRUNCH

- This is an annual event that will be held in February 2023. Typically, it is a reception including professional mom/son pictures followed by mass, brunch and heart-warming tributes. Your son might say you don't need to go, but this is a real treat for all involved. Reservation details and a link will be made available by early January.
- Church clothes are appropriate. Think school uniform. Blazers suggested but not required. No jeans.
- Professional photos available starting 8:30 a.m. Online ordering and prepayment are recommended to expedite the process but you may also pay at door. A link will be sent out closer to the date.
- Seating is first come, first served and the boys will want to sit with their friends if possible so plan ahead with your group to find a table together.
- Mass begins at 10:00 a.m., followed by brunch and speakers. It typically ends by 12:00pm.

"BRIDGE THE GAP"

- The "GAP" is the difference between the price of tuition and the amount it actually costs the school to educate one student at Jesuit. Parents are asked to contribute to the "Bridge the Gap" campaign each year as a way to make up for this difference in a tax deductible way.
- Send in your pledge/response card promptly or expect a personal call or visit from a committee member.
- Participation is what counts and no contribution is too small. Jesuit aims for 100% participation, as a high participation is important when applying for grants.

CAR POOLS

- Your Mentor Network group is geographically sorted by area/zip code, so it is a great source for carpooling.
- You can also use the Parent Directory in RangerNet to help find families who live close to you. Login to RangerNet, Select "Directory", choose "Parent" or "Student", enter your zip code into the search bar, and select "Include All Fields" to find families in your zip code. A list of all families in your zip code will be shown. Click Map view to see other families in your area on a map of the metroplex.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Phones Cell phones may be used during the school day <u>outside</u> of classrooms, in the cafeteria, and in Hughes Hall. Phones will be confiscated by Student Affairs if used inappropriately, during class time, or against the instruction of a teacher.
- Attendance Please contact the Student Affairs office by email at studentaffairs@jesuitcp.org or by voicemail at Ext. 325 by 10am on the day your son is absent, arriving late, or leaving early from school. Please provide documentation for your son's absence (e.g. doctor's note). Planned absences must be reported to the Student Affairs office (Ext. 325) prior to the absences.
- **Ranger Connection** is open from 10:30am to 4:00pm on weekdays for purchase of your official Jesuit apparel. Please also visit our online store open 24/7 at <u>www.rangerconnection.org</u>. Items can be ordered for delivery or for in-store pick-up. You can also create an account for your son online and deposit money there for snacks and miscellaneous school supply purchases during the school day.
- Diagnosed medical conditions/Medication forms This form indicates prescription and non-prescription meds your son is allowed to take at school. Medicine can only be kept and administered the Office of Student Affairs. Students cannot carry any medication with them on Campus. Common medicines (such as Acetaminophen or lbuprofen) are provided by Jesuit with parental permission as indicated on the required Medication form which is completed online through Magnus. Carrying emergency items (like an EpiPen) requires documented approval from parents and the Office of Student Affairs. Any other diagnosed medical condition, such as asthma or diabetes, which may require accommodations must also be supported by documentation from a doctor. - Pickup/Drop-off Procedure please follow the flow of traffic in the front circle during carpool; the outer two lanes are for waiting for a student and the middle lane is for exiting the circle drive after you've picked up your student. All freshmen are to enter the building in the doors to the Hall of Honors, so be sure to pull up ALL THE WAY TO THE FRONT OF THE LINE when picking up or dropping off to allow others to turn into the circle drive from Inwood. Please do not park and/or wait for your son across from the school, as these are places of business that are not affiliated with Jesuit.
- Changes to your address, phone number, email, etc.? Log into RangerNet to update your profile. Once you log in, click on your name in the upper righthand corner, select "Profile" from the drop down menu, Edit your information, and Save.

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
